Sheffield International Outreach

10 people from various churches, locations, and backgrounds responded to a call for workers to do door to door evangelism and to run a book stall. A main point of the mission was to receive invites to come back to houses, especially from Mirpuri (Pakistani) people. This to my surprise and I suppose unbelief happened quite a few times. We are still receiving positive stories about re-visits from Christ Church Central Sheffield. I knocked on over 500 doors, with the help of a partner and as a group we must have knocked on 5000's of doors. There has been talk of doing a similar thing in Sheffield next year as well talk of whether we could or should do the same in Woking/Guildford. Hoping for more challenges and excitement ahead – (Dave from Woking who responded to that call)

Afghanistan a year on...




Life is a struggle for many and we remember Afghanistan a year after the Taliban took control. Jane reminds us of that change:

Afghan society can be brutal towards women and with the arrival of the Taliban things have become so much harder. My young student and class helper's brother punched her in the eye so hard that the retina all but disintegrated. I showed the scans to an eye surgeon who said there was no hope. Instead of blaming the boy, I was castigated for being the bearer of bad news. Frozan had been a keen football player with ambitions to be a doctor. She tried to kill herself when the Taliban marched into Kabul. Her small private school where I have been teaching once a week online for the past two years, was started by an Afghan friend of mine for poor children. Last August, all girls over 12 had to "graduate" and the entire school had to close recently after ISIS threatened to kill the girls. Plans to continue secretly are on hold because fighting and

bombing in the area is too intense. A bomb exploded metres from Frozan last week on her way home. She narrowly escaped death. I now teach her and her old headmistress once a week online when wifi is working. I also teach older girls three times a week at a sister school in another part of Afghanistan. These lessons are a lifeline, a connection with the outside world and a thread of hope that life might not always be like this.

Andrew and I both have other students who turn up every week on the dot to discuss deep issues of life and I spend my week fielding WhatsApp and Telegram messages from students and teachers. I can listen, care and pray. They love receiving encouraging psalms in Dari. The English lessons are fuzzy, disjointed and chaotic, but we all laugh a lot, and sometimes cry. My longing of course is that they will feel the love of the Saviour. They have been brought into our lives for His reasons, and He has a plan for them to somehow come to know Him.
